WARNING

TO AVOID INJURY, read, understand and follow all instructions and warnings in this manual before using your *VARILITE* back support.

There are hazards associated with the use of wheelchairs and adaptive equipment. If you misuse your wheelchair or your back support you can be seriously injured.

Installation and adjustment of your *VARILITE* back support should be performed only by an authorized dealer or qualified therapist. Improper installation or adjustment can result in equipment damage and serious injuries.

- Ensure that your VARILITE hardware is tightened and functions according to these instructions before using your wheelchair. If you are unable to check the tightness of hardware, please seek qualified assistance.
- Never use your wheelchair if any VARILITE hardware is missing, malfunctioning, or broken. Seek qualified assistance with any repairs or adjustments.
- Never exceed the weight capacity of the back support. Never perform weight training that causes you to exceed the weight capacity of the back support. If you exceed the recommended weight capacity you can damage equipment and be seriously injured.
- Never exceed the weight capacity of the wheelchair as specified by the wheelchair manufacturer. Never perform weight training that causes you to exceed the weight capacity of the wheelchair. If you exceed the recommended weight capacity you can damage equipment and be seriously injured.
- Never lift the wheelchair by the back support.
- Never use the back support without its cover. For your safety, VARILITE cushion covers are made with flame retardant materials.
- Never modify your *VARILITE* back support or use it in a way not described by these instructions.
- Follow all instructions and warnings provided by the wheelchair manufacturer.



Use in a Motor Vehicle



This seating system has not been dynamically tested and does not meet requirements of ANSIWC20/Vol 4 or conform to ISO 16840-4 for the safe use of seating devices for use in motor vehicles. To avoid serious injury or death, do not use this seating system in a motor vehicle.

VARILITE Talon is designed to be compatible with rigid wheelchairs with horizontal stabilizer bars 0.75 in. (19mm) in diameter, noting the following exceptions:


The system can be used only with wheelchairs with round stabilizer bars.

Stabilizer bar diameter cannot be greater than or less than 0.75 in. (19mm)



Assembly and Mounting Steps

VARILITE Talon attaches to the wheelchair's stabilizer bar (also called a rigidizer bar) using the Mounting Bracket, Through-Hole Clamp Bracket, and Threaded Clamp Bracket.

1. Locate and mark the centerline of the wheelchair's stabilizer bar. (Fig. 1)




2. Place Mounting Bracket on top of the Through-Hole Clamp Bracket.

Insert (2) 1/4-20 x 1.25 in. Button Head Cap Screws and Washers through the single slot of of the Mounting Bracket and into the Through-hole Clamp Bracket. (Fig. 2)



 Place Mounting Bracket and Through-Hole Clamp Bracket on top of the stabilizer bar at the centerline.

Place Threaded Clamp Bracket on the opposite side of the stabilizer bar and screw the parts together.

Tighten the screws just enough to hold the parts in place.

Do not fully tighten until final adjustments are made.

The vertical portion of the Mounting Bracket should be parallel to the back canes of the wheelchair. (Fig. 3)



4. Position the Shell/Cushion assembly against the Mounting Bracket where it provides appropriate PSIS (Posterior Superior Iliac Spine) support.

Note: It is not necessary to remove the Cushion and Cover during installation.

 Attach the Shell/Cushion assembly to the Mounting Bracket using (2) 1/4-20 x 0.5 in. Button Head Cap Screws and Washers. (Fig. 4)

Tighten the screws just enough to hold the parts in place.

Do not fully tighten until final adjustments are made.







PLACEMENT OPTIONS

The Mounting Bracket screws can attach to the Shell/Cushion assembly in three locations. The multiple locations, coupled with the vertical slots on the Mounting Bracket, allow a wide range of height adjustment. (Fig. 5)

To increase the range of adjustment, reverse the Mounting Bracket so it attaches to the bottom of the stabilizer bar. (Fig. 6)



6. Talon can be adjusted for height, depth, and angle. (Fig. 7)



Complete the positioning of the Talon by adjusting height, depth and angle, and securely tightening all screws.

Note: When properly mounted, the Talon should stay securely in place without any movement of the Mounting Bracket or Clamp Brackets.

If the Clamp Brackets rotate around the stabilizer bar, the screws have not been tightened enough. Clamp Bracket screws should be tightened as much as possible by hand.

Note: Fully tightening the Clamp Bracket screws by hand will not damage the wheelchair's stabilizer bar.



Mounting Bracket Selection

For most users, the Talon is positioned with the Shell/Cushion in line with the back of the wheelchair canes. Our selection guide shows the recommended Mounting Bracket based on the stabilizer bar depth, as well as the range of posterior and anterior adjustment possible with each bracket.

Inflating Cushion

- 1. To inflate cushion, remove load from cushion.
- 2. Open air valve by turning valve counterclockwise.
- 3. When cushion is fully inflated, close air valve by turning valve clockwise.

Adjusting Cushion

- 1. To adjust the air level of the *VARILITE* back support, begin with the cushion fully inflated and the valve closed.
- 2. Position wheelchair user securely in wheelchair.
- 3. Turn the valve counterclockwise to open the valve and release air.
- 4. Close the valve when the air level that provides the support needed for the user's comfort and functionality is reached.

Removing Cushion

- 1. Pull the cushion up to detach the cover from the shell.
- 2. Detach the Cover Tabs from the hook patch on the inside of the Shell and pull the Cover Tabs through the slots in the shell.

Note: Reverse the steps above to reattach the cushion.



Care and Maintenance

- The aluminum shell can be cleaned with soap and warm water. Do not saturate. Avoid getting water under the edge trim.
- The self-inflating cushion can be wiped with a damp cloth.
- The mesh cushion cover can be removed and washed. Machine wash at 140° F (60° C). Air dry.
- Never store your back support in conditions of extreme heat or exposure to direct sunlight for long periods of time.
- Never store sharp or heavy objects on top of your back cushion.
- Once a week, leave valve open overnight, allowing cushion to fully inflate in an unloaded state. See page 11 for adjustment instructions.



Troubleshooting

System rotates around the stabilizer bar

The Clamp Brackets are not tight enough. Fully tighten the Clamp Bracket screws.

Shell/Cushion assembly does not support the PSIS

Adjust the height of the Shell. Loosen the Mounting Bracket screws to slide the Shell up or down in the Mounting Bracket slots; use different holes on the Shell; or reverse the Mounting Bracket as needed to increase the range of adjustment

Too much or too little seat depth

Loosen the Clamp Bracket screws and use the slot for posterior or anterior adjustment. Depending on the depth of the stabilizer bar, and the amount of posterior or anterior adjustment needed, a different length Mounting Bracket may be needed. Refer to the Mounting Bracket Selection Guide (page 10). Fully tighten the Clamp Bracket screws.

Cushion slips on the Shell

Make sure the CoverTabs are firmly attached to the loop patches on the Shell. Re-install the cushion if necessary.

Where at its sole discretion VARILITE deems Product eligible for warranty repair or replacement, VARILITE will pay the shipping and handling associated with returning repaired or replaced Product to Owner. In instances where VARILITE deems a returned product ineligible for warranty service, VARILITE will, if possible, repair product for a reasonable charge that includes return shipping and handling.
